Warren was a National Director at the NHRA for many years and managed the Famosa NHRA track, spending the last 20 years helping to growth the Buttonwillow track and hosting all of the events. He is missed greatly for his attentiveness and humor. The U.S. Majors Tour is the pinnacle of championship racing in North America and is where America's best amateur drivers race. This will be one of the largest Club Racing fields at Buttonwillow Raceway this year drawing from the entire West Coast.
